7:00 PM - Meeting was Called to Order by Council Chair Howard Stern.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – Terry Foley reported the account balance is \$5,884.

7:02 PM - <u>Police Report -</u> Assistant Chief David Dickey presented the latest 28-day Ventura Police Crime Report for the Pierpont area – new reporting based on NIBRS statistics. There were 7 assault offenses; 20 property crimes; 16 society crimes for a total Group A crimes of 43.

<u>State Parks Update</u> – Although Tyson Butzke was not in attendance, he did sent an email updating on three issues: State will be putting out lifeguard towers at the end of this month but won't be staffing them until sometime in May; the beaches are continued to be cleaned up and staff is working with the Police Department to tag and remove various homeless huts that have been built with debris along the lanes and the next major event that we will be having in the Park is the Mountains to the Beach marathon.

7:15 PM - Committee Updates

<u>STVR</u>- Terry Foley reported that the City is preparing a proposal for a revised STVR ordinance and mediator Dave Ceppos will be brought in to facilitate the process.

<u>Beach</u>- Kaycee Krieg had no new update. There was a Beach Clean-up on April with low attendance. The next one is scheduled on May 6. At 8:30 AM.

<u>Seaward Beautification</u> - Dan Roundtree reported that he is working with city's Economic Development Department to create a Pierpont Ambassador Program that would dedicate an employee two days a week to maintain lower Seaward (similar to Downtown Ventura). Funding of this program is still in the works but could be part businesses and part city.

7:35 PM City Council Update – Joe Schroeder

Deputy Mayor Joe Schroeder reported on the Interconnect Project as well the possibility of the City Ventura hosting the X Games. Joe also talked about the status of the Marina Park Water Pure Project and estimated timeline. Some residents expressed concerns about logistics and affects on impacted neighbors so Mr. Schroder suggested that Linda Sumansky be contacted to have future resident updates.
